#### **July 2025**

Dear LCRA Members,

Summer has arrived and I am not going to complain about the heat! Our Lake Jam event has a tremendous hit and hats off to the Events Committee for planning this for us. Looking forward to the July 3<sup>rd</sup> Fireworks, July 5<sup>th</sup> Boat Parade and the Beach Dance later this month. Please remember to secure your tickets for the Beach Dance event. They are available in the office if you need them.

Here is another important rule reminder. When your boat is moving with the engine running you must be inside the "playpen" railed area of your craft. We have observed individuals sitting or standing on the front of the pontoon outside the rails, and some placing their feet in the water while the boat is in motion. This is a very unsafe practice and could lead to extreme injury. If a person were to fall off the front of a moving boat and become trapped between the pontoons, it would not take but a matter of seconds to reach that rotating propeller on your engine. Our Safety Patrol is dedicated to your safety and please be cautioned that this unsafe practice could lead to a fine or possible suspension if not corrected. The same goes for being outside the rails on the back of your boat as well.

- 1. Call to order-Board President R. Cupari called the meeting to order.
- 2. Cupari led the Board and guests in the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3. Trustees Cupari, Sibila, Barnes and Streb were present. Julie Edwards was present. General Manager Erin Keller was present.
- 4. Dan Sibila is the new Vice President of the Board.
- 5. Julie Edwards was appointed new Board of Trustees member, and she was appointed as the Communications Trustee. She also will serve as Board liaison to the Rules Committee. (This follows the resignation of Mike Rideout from the Board of Trustees and the making of Dan Sibila as Vice President.)
- 6. The April 15, 2025 minutes were approved unanimously by the Board.
- 7. Treasurer Stan Barnes gave the Treasurer's report, and it was approved unanimously.
- 1. General Manager Erin Keller gave the Manager's Report, and it was approved unanimously. She pointed out that the Beach will be closed on July 3(fireworks) and July 12(beach dance). Kudos were given to lifeguard, Makayla Mahaffey, for her rescue of a child who had wandered into deep water.
- 2. Committee Reports:
- a. John Streb was made Float Boat Committee chair and will be talking to Jimmy Morehouse to gather information.
- b. Clubhouse Renovation Advisory Committee: Randy Cupari reported the following:

Parapets are rotting and need to be replaced with trim. 2 of 5 HVAC units need to be replaced. New drainage system is needed to address roof drainage issue. New drainage will drain in the direction of Fulton Road. Will need to be approved by County.

Will get 3 estimates for the roof replacement. Trying to accommodate all events this fall without cancellations.

- c. Beach and Grounds Committee: John Streb reported: Float Boat Parade will be on JULY 5TH. One of the tractors is down. John thinks he can fix it.
- d. Events committee: Board Pres. Cupari is assuming lead on this committee in place of Mike Rideout. July 3rd is fireworks, July 4th. is party on the sandbar and July 5th is the Float Boat Parade. June 27th is the first Final Fridays of Summer-5:30-7:30 Happy Hour on the Patio(BYOB No Glass!)
- e. Finance Committee Stan Barnes reported that there had been no Finance Committee meeting.
- f. Rules Committee Julie Edwards reported that the rules committee is reviewing what rules may have to be amended if the By-Laws are amended by the membership to include electronic voting.
- g. Environmental Committee Dan Sibila reported

that AquaDoc treated for filamentous algae on June 9. Early May and June 5th Eurofins tested for water quality and will test again in mid July. Erin Keller added that spawning is over and muskrat trapping will resume, that Stark County Health Dept. checks beach water quality every two weeks as well as the state of the concession stand and the lifeguards.

Old Business: Randy Cupari stated that FEMA grant was still on hold. Dan Sibila stated that some work is being done on the sand volley ball court and he has requested that boats NOT be left or stored on it. Dan Sibila reported that membership will be receiving a ballot to vote on whether or not to allow electronic voting.

Electronic voting will be discussed at July Board meeting. Erin Keller stated that ODNR has inspected the dam and spillway and she is awaiting a full report from them.

New Business: Tree planting along Fulton Road is to occur very soon.

Stan Barnes moved to approve the \$2,950.00 estimate from Southway Fence Co. to repair the patio gate.

John Streb seconded the motion. Motion was approved by a unanimous vote.

#### Questions from membership present:

- 1. Karen and David Manhart a. Concerned about speed of traffic on the roadway that runs between the little lake and the main lake. Many walkers but not a lot of room to walk. Would like speed tables and/or sidewalks. Pres. Cupari said he would write to Jackson Twp regarding speed tables. b. Concerned about the trees/shrubs that are on private property that block the view when turning left on Fulton from West Blvd. c. Want better information on times and dates of lake events
- 2.Bob Preece, Lake Patrol, . concerns: a. Should be only 1 person, not 2, not 1 adult and 1 child, not 2 children, in 1 person kayak. If boat is less than 18' in length, children under 10 yrs must wear properly sized PFD. b. NO ONE should be on front of pontoon boat. Any violation shall result in a TICKET, not a warning. c. No swimming except in buoyed areas or no more than 25' from your shoreline of boat. NO SWIMMING IN COMMONS AREAS.

d. 35 boats have no 2025 stickers. This is a substantial improvement from last year.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT Financial Results for the Month of May 2025

The activity level at the LCRA increased significantly during the month of May. As the busy summer season starts in earnest, the income and expense levels increase as well. That increased activity is reflected in the financial statements. Financial performance for the month of May was positive overall with the Association reporting a small net loss from operations and a positive result in Other Income allowing the Association to post Net Income of \$4,793 for the month. Overall, on a year-to-date, consolidated basis, results continue to be positive and net income from both Operations and in total is ahead of budget and well ahead of last year.

The financial results for the month of May are as follows. The Association posted net income of \$4,793. Total Operating revenue for the month was \$106,035 and Other revenue totaled \$5,570. Total revenue was over budget projections by \$30,525. Several larger variances contributed to the overage. Revenue from Association Membership Dues was over budget by \$16,003, primarily due to an adjustment that Hall-Kistler, the LCRA's new accounting firm, made to the revenue recognition formula we had been using. Other income accounts over budget included Clubhouse and Pavilion Rentals, and Collection of Prior Assessments. Interest Income was also over budget by \$2,820 as accrued revenue from Assoc. investments was recognized during the month of May.

Total Operating Expenses for the month of May totaled \$106,812 and came in over the budgeted amount of \$89,467. The largest variances occurred in wage and salary expense accounts as the budget only included 2 pay periods in May when actually there were 3 paydays during the month. Other significant variances occurred in the Maintenance Expense accounts. In addition to the normal increase in expense associated with gearing up for the season, several large projects were completed in May. Painting happened in the back of the clubhouse by the patio, and the deck was refreshed with a coat of stain. Additionally, insurance expense was recognized in May as the invoices are paid as received rather than being booked as a prepaid expense. The net result of the above activity produced the net income of \$4,763.

Year-to-date net income for the fiscal year is \$166,884. Net income from operations only year-to-date is \$83,842 compared to \$31,844 for the same period last year.

The Association balance sheet as of May 31, 2025 reflects total Association assets of \$3,217,050. Current assets totaled \$1,490,410. Cash and cash equivalent balances totaled \$1,464,384 as of the end of May. That total was made up of \$87,936 in Capital Improvement Funds, \$136,700 in Dock Maintenance and Replacement Reserves. Additional items include \$93,215 available in the LCRA checking account, \$558,845 in a Vanguard account and \$586,814 in donated capital for clubhouse renovation. Funds not needed for operating expenses in the near term are invested to generate a return until they are needed for operations.

Once approved by the Board of Trustees, the complete financials for the month of May and year-to-date will be posted to the Members Section of the Lakecable.org website for member review.
