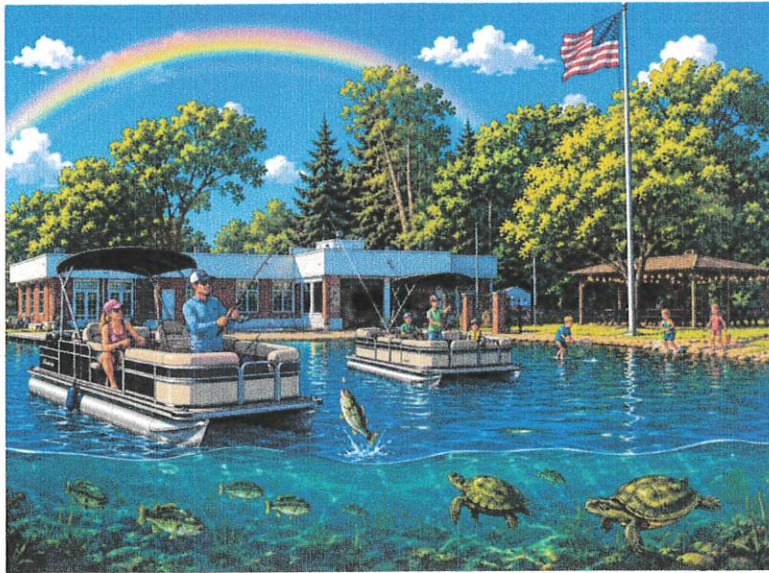

Dear Members,

By far, July is the busiest month of the year and then we added on the 100th Anniversary!! Thank you to Emily Evans, Jim Barkett, the entire committee, volunteers, staff and those that donated to make this such a successful event. Everyone I spoke with truly enjoyed the day and we could not be more thankful for all of their hard work. As we move into August, we still have plenty of nice weather and events on the horizon.

Over the past 45 days, water safety has become a major concern for the board. For boating, multiple incidents of people outside of the pontoon fencing while underway. The worst being feet in the water while underway. Additionally, there have been swimmers well outside of the 25 feet limit. We expect the rules to be followed for the safety of our members and guests. You can download a copy of the rules and regulations from lakecable.org, have it sent via email, or obtain a printed copy during office hours. I would highly recommend attending one of the upcoming Boater Safety Courses which are on the first Wednesday of each month (next one being August 5 at 7PM).

From our last board meeting, we will be evaluating rentals of the clubhouse. Major items include the need for staff to be at the event, the costs of events and making certain that all renters understand the rules, requirements and conditions for any rental. We will report back on the findings by the end of September.

After a lot of work, planning and perseverance by the Clubhouse Renovation committee, we have finally crossed to the most critical phase, repairing the roof. This will entail many little steps to ensure proper draining from our roof. Please read the highlights in the coming pages of this newsletter. The Committee along with the Board have unanimously approved the proposal and the amount asked. This required phase is covered by donations to the clubhouse and our existing capital ledger; therefore, no assessment. Please do read further in this newsletter to understand the impact and importance of this next step and some of the added benefits. Also, know that a vote by the membership is forthcoming.

In closing, I would like to thank the Woman's and Sportsman's Clubs for their donation to the kitchen oven repairs and again to the Woman's Club for their donation of a new flag and stand in the Pine Room. Let's all have a great August and enjoy as much summer as possible before school is back in session!

Lake Cable Recreation Association Board of Trustees Meeting Tuesday, July 21, 2026, 7:00PM Pine Room

- 1) Call to Order - Sibila. 7:02pm
- 2) Pledge of Allegiance – Sibila
- 3) Roll Call. Present: Dan Sibila, Julie Edwards, Peter Trumpower, Kurt Leibensperger, Randy Cupari
- 4) Approval of June 16, 2026 Minutes – Leibensperger. Approved 5-0
- 5) Treasurer's Report – Trumpower. Income up 2.4%, and Expenses down 8.9%, due to many factors, including vacancy in General Manager position. Full report elsewhere in this newsletter.
- 6) Committee Reports
 - a. Float Boat – Leibensperger. Meeting set for Thursday at Winking Lizard to discuss Boat Parade. No action on Float boat day yet, however, John Streb is stepping down from chairing the fall day.
 - b. Beach and Grounds – Trumpower. Water is clear and good, due to abundant rainfall...weeds are under control. Mechanical issues need addressed, including dock repair and stabilization, as well as the ladder on the beach by the swing is broken, needs repaired immediately.
 - c. Events - Leibensperger. 100th Anniversary a successful event, nice weather, ski show & band. Spent \$1500 on the party, but good sponsorship results should mean this is not coming out of association money. 400 attended. Plus, group photo of lake members taken, suggestion to get large prints of the day for the clubhouse to memorialize the party. 2000 photos online for 1 year. This event took place thanks to volunteers on the social committee, Emily Evans, Jim Burkett, Joy Burch, Dan Sibila, Connie Little, Molly Romano, Pam Leibensperger and Suzie Thomas.
Upcoming – Music on patio with Gordon Oliver on July 31, and Dan Monea on August 28, Labor Day concert & Float Boat Parade (Labor Day weekend), and Golf Outing in September.
 - d. Finance – Trumpower. No report.

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- e. Rules & Regulations – Edwards. No report.
- f. Environmental – Sibila. Randy and Bob Wynkoop sampled the lake water, per Aqua Doc water looks clean, helped by abundant rain. Our ODNR dam specialist is leaving, referred our case to Matthew, the project lead for ODNR.
- g. Clubhouse Renovation – Cupari. No committee meeting scheduled.

7) Old Business

- a. Clubhouse Project Update – Cupari. Plans finalized for clubhouse restoration, phase #1, replacing our ancient roof. Plans being finalized, to be submitted to membership for a vote. Email will be sent, and e-vote will be scheduled. Work can start September 8th pending member approval.
- b. Stark Country Property Tax Appeal – Sibila. Informal appeal on July 1st. Result is tax assessment switched from residential to commercial, hence higher rates. However, our appeal got the tax rate lowered to \$450,000, but since we're on the same tier as Meyers Lake, Willowdale and Congress Lakes, we will check their assessments. Dan met with Tom Gibbons to review our 2017 tax appeal.
- c. Enbridge Project – Edwards. Big progress, working through project manager, Dave. First, Diver scheduled this week from Florida to test the hole size to determine actual damage. Second, Enbridge has committed to remove the transmission lines from the lake bed once the project is complete next spring. Look for a potential meeting with Enbridge and membership. Enbridge contractor will remove straps tying lines to the lake bed, and float the pipes up for removal. Finally, pipe replacement project is scheduled to start in September.
- d. GM Position Status – Sibila. Received additional resumes, schedule up to 5 extra interviews. Staff/board has done a fine job picking up the slack. Ideally have a new person in place by October.
- e. Dock Rationalization - Sibila. Noted that many docks need repaired/replaced. Work should commence to fix those boards.

8) New Business

- a. Brick Pavers will start now. Last campaign netted lake \$29000, which can help on clubhouse/capital expenses.
- b. Executive Session determined we need to get security/staff present for rental events.

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- c. Julie attended Enbridge meeting at the clubhouse, with county/township officials. There is a 4-way stop coming to the Island/West Boulevard intersection, as it's one of the most dangerous in the township.
- d. Member request for help in removal of boat that was left by old owners, is in terrible condition and 10 years removed from having a lake sticker.
- e. AED devices—2 new ones purchased. Guard shack has the active one now, and will work on training staff. Look at clubhouse/pavilion for second one, as there is a 5 minute window to use one to save a life.

9) Comments and Questions from Members (30 minutes)

- a. Mike McElfresh brought up questions regarding the clubhouse roof project, as well as the fact that the pipeline on the lake bed is kept in place by concrete cups, which can be removed. Asked for an Enbridge meeting with members, Julie would try to coordinate.
- b. Lee Vitale asked questions about Aqua Doc water treatment, requested a member meeting on clubhouse project, and removal of pipeline easement once pipes are removed.
- c. Dave Herbert once again brought up his request to remove the temporary parking lot in the park on North Island. Cupari suggested some members have used the lot, and requested it to stay. Sibia asked for an October time frame to resolve the issue.
- d. Claudette Hankins questioned the new build, and if the stone lined up with the property line. It does. Questioned Van's workload, and asked if additional employees were needed.
- e. Robb Hankins, asked about top 2 concerns for the new GM. Sibia said accountability and responsibility to membership
- f. Molly Romano brought up trip hazard in the pavilion. It is on the maintenance list.
- g. Nissa Micheleck brought up a big flat rock holding up a board on Pickerel commons.
- h. John Streb thanked the board for working hard, and mentioned he will not be in town for the boat parade on Labor Day weekend, but asked people to attend Thursday meeting at Winking Lizard if they wanted to help.
- i. Bob Preece suggested a scout project to repair docks owned by older folks in the lake, as a way to fix those docks and make them safer.
- j. Emily Evans asked about the cost of pipeline removal from the lake, Edwards mentioned 100% of cost assumed by Enbridge. Also asked for a timeline of the board's discovery of the Enbridge project.
- k. Kim Morrison asked why board initially decided to fight Enbridge on the pipeline removal.

Clubhouse Renovation Update

Dear Lake Cable Recreation Association Members,

As most of you know, the Board of Trustees, together with the Clubhouse Renovation Committee, has been working diligently on the Clubhouse Renovation Project. We are now ready to move forward and would like to provide additional details before presenting the project to the membership for approval through our electronic voting system.

Because the clubhouse is more than 100 years old, this phase will focus on critical structural repairs that must be completed before replacing the approximately **15,000 square feet of roofing**. The following work is included in this critical phase:

1. Reset the building's main support columns in new concrete footers.
2. Replace one support post in a storage area.
3. Install girder tie-down strapping at all required locations.
4. Ensure all rafters are properly shimmed and fastened to existing girders.
5. Correct twisting in one beam.
6. Re-shim twisted rafters according to engineering drawings.
7. Install a sister board to reinforce one cracked rafter per engineering drawings.
8. Remove the existing parapet wall, soffit, and gutters.
9. Remove the existing deck to facilitate installation of a new drainage system.
10. Remove the existing roof.
11. Install a new roof and replace damaged wood as necessary.
12. Install new fascia, soffit, and gutters.
13. Install a new drainage system that discharges into the storm sewer at Fulton Drive.
14. Repair concrete and asphalt areas disturbed during drainage system installation.
15. Install a new composite deck with the same basic footprint as the existing deck. The new deck will be ADA-compliant with access from both the east and west sides.
16. Install a security gate and a low-profile clear glass railing between the deck and the members' patio.
17. Install a new metal roof on the main entrance portico, as removal of the existing parapet wall will expose bare wood.

After receiving three sealed bids from local general contractors, the Board selected **Scheetz Building Corporation**. Their proposal was the lowest bid received and provided the most comprehensive cost and pricing details.

The total project cost is **\$725,000**.

LCRA currently has:

- **\$611,000** in member-donated funds on deposit at CSE Credit Union designated for this project.
- **\$635,000** in a Vanguard Money Market account reserved for capital improvements.

As a result, **no special assessment will be required** to complete this work. Following completion of this work, LCRA will still retain approximately **\$521,000** for future capital improvement projects.

Our projected start date is **September 8**. The work will have minimal impact on the use of the facility. Only the Cherry Room and back wooden patio will not be available for a period during this phase. Currently, the validation of eligible voters and preparations for an electronic vote is underway. As before, you will be able to vote in the office with assistance from the staff where needed.

Personalized Brick Program

The Board is also bringing back the **Personalized Brick Program**, which was last offered approximately eight years ago. Planning is currently underway for the program's relaunch.

For a donation amount that will be announced at a later date, members will be able to purchase personalized bricks to be installed either on the clubhouse patio or at the main entrance. Orders will be accepted during the winter months, and installation is planned for **Spring 2027**. All proceeds from the program will be directed to the Capital Improvement Fund.

TREASURER'S REPORT
Financial Results for the Month of June 2026

The end of June marks the third month of the third quarter of the Association's fiscal year. Through the first nine months of the fiscal year, income is +2.4% over the same time last year, and expense is -8.9%. Results continue to be positive and in total are tracking ahead of budget as of the end of the third quarter. Similarly, results are positive compared to last year for the same period. When the non-recurring income of \$55,500 in donations received last year is removed, net income is ahead of last year as well, driven by higher Vanguard Interest Income and Initiation Fees.

During June the Association posted income from operations of \$20,035. Total net income including interest earned on invested funds totaled \$28,592. Total revenue for the month was \$111,351 which was over the budgeted amount of \$103,765 by \$7,586. Most income accounts were very near budget with a few exceptions. Membership Dues, Initiation Fees and Dock Rental income were over budget.

Total expenses for the month of June totaled \$91,317 and came in under the budgeted amount of \$100,417, under budget by \$9,100. The primary expense account variances which contributed to this result, Fireworks, Admin/Office Wages, Maintenance Wages, and Insurance. The net result of the above produced net income of \$28,592 as mentioned above, which was \$24,294 over budget. Year-to-date net income for the first nine months of the fiscal year totals \$205,006 (+20% over last year).

The Balance Sheet for the Association as of June 30, 2026, reflects total Association assets of \$3,370,555. Current assets totaled \$1,781,904. Cash and cash equivalent balances totaled \$1,730,225 as of the end of June. That total was made up of \$124,248 in Capital Improvement Funds, and \$198,247 in Dock Replacement Reserves. These two funds will have additional amounts moved to Vanguard in July to earn a higher return. Additional items include \$316,174 available in the LCRA checking account, \$478,265 in a Vanguard account and \$611,000 in donated capital for clubhouse renovation on deposit at CSE Federal Credit Union. Reserve fund balances have increased slightly as interest payments have been accrued and the overall cash and cash equivalent balance decreased due to a smaller balance in the Association checking account.

Once approved by the Board of Trustees, the complete financials for the month of June 2026 will be posted to the Members Section of the Lakecable.org website for member review.

The steak fry last month was the most successful with 437 paid tickets verses 417 last year, net profits exceeding past years by \$2,188 despite the increase in beef prices. The Club has two CD's totaling \$17,449.63 and total cash of \$27,139.44 available for future Club and steak fry expenses.

Lake Report

Kurt Leibensperger stated the water and fishing were good and weeds are under control. He also stated Enbridge was monitoring the small gas leak in the Lake and they will begin installing new pipelines on East and West Boulevards around September.

Old Business and New Business.

Dan thanked everyone who assisted in making the steak fry a great success and we will need to review ticket prices in lieu of rising costs. Dan introduced Lee Dione who was approved by the Board to replace Jason Gasper-Hulvat on the Board. Dan introduced James Fye, whose company deals with community engagement and asked the membership to approve the addition of an additional Trustee position, the Trustee of Member Engagement, and that James Fye fill that position. The motion was made and approved by the members.

Members voice various concerns regarding the Lake, Club and Association matters. We have one new member, Mike Wucinick.

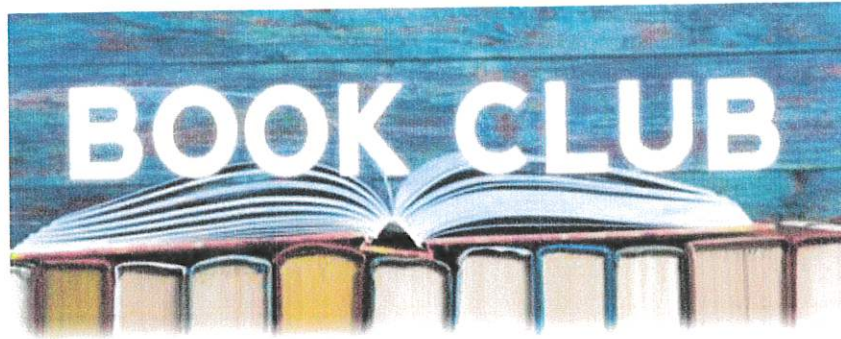

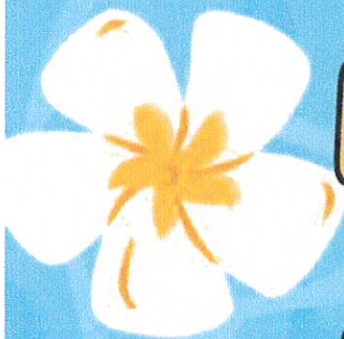

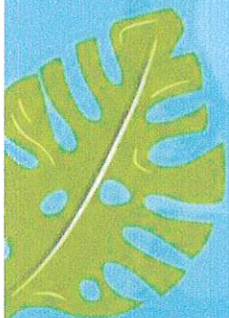
August gardening tip: Keep plants deeply watered during dry spells. Avoid late season pruning, or heavy fertilization that encourages tender growth vulnerable to early frost.

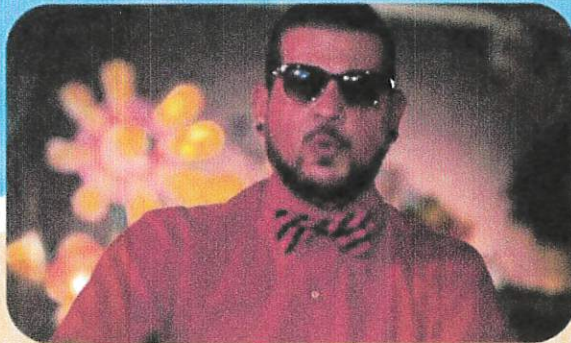

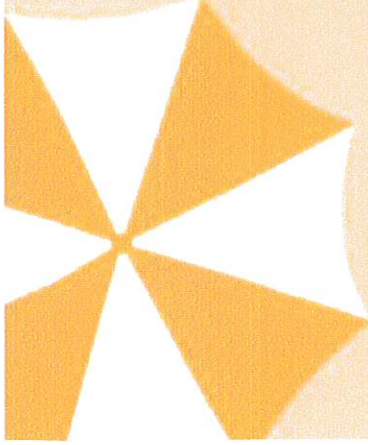

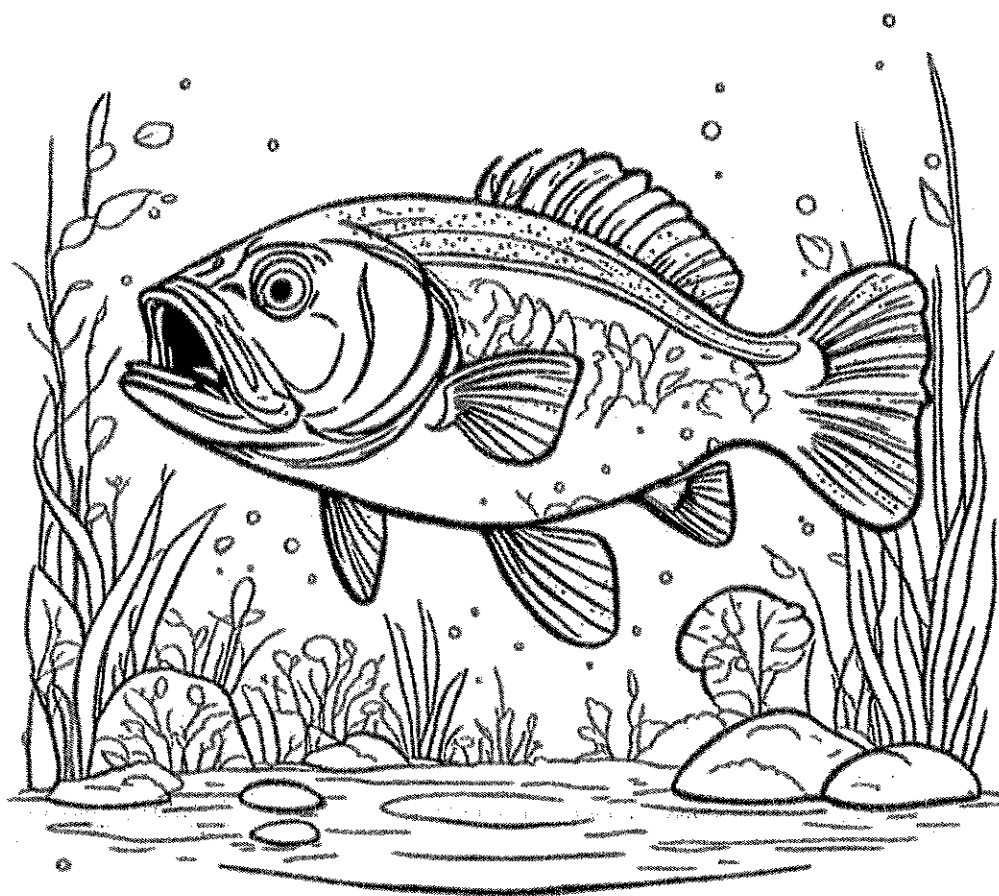

Effective April 27 and until Further Notice

DAILY BAG LIMITS & SIZES PER MEMBERSHIP, PER DAY

Not to be confused with per person - Keep in Tackle Box on Boat

BLUEGILL and other SUNFISH (PUMPKINSEED, REDEAR, and WARMOUTH)

12 per membership, per day, any size except from May 11 to June 12- Catch & Release during spawning time.

BULLHEAD CATFISH

No limit on size or number.

1 per membership, per day, 19" or larger.

CHANNEL CATFISH

1 per membership, per day, 19" or larger.

CRAPPIE

12 per membership, per day, any size.

LARGEMOUTH BASS: 2 per membership per day, under 13", except from May 11- June 12 - Catch & Release during spawning time.

PERCH

12 per membership, per day, any size.

SMALLMOUTH BASS: Catch & Release.

WALLEYE

2 per membership, 17" or larger, per day. All Walleye under 17" catch and release

EXCHANGING OF FISH

Legal size fish may NOT be returned to the water unless done immediately after removing from the hook. Fish may NOT be returned from bag or stringer to replace with a larger catch.

SPECIAL NOTE: Please consider releasing all Redear sunfish. Their nickname is Shellcracker. They eat zebra mussels. While the Zebra mussel infestation has abated, we want to support controlling the Zebra mussel population by increasing the Redear population. They lay far fewer eggs than Bluegills and are more susceptible to overharvest.

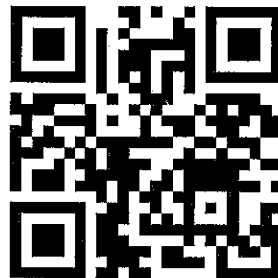

Cormorant Update

ODNR cormorant regulations involve managing double-crested cormorants, which are federally protected under the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, requiring special U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS) permits for lethal control to protect property, aquaculture, and endangered species; Ohio uses a Public Resource Depredation Order (PRDO) and other permits for management, focusing on non-lethal methods first, with lethal control authorized for significant damage, especially around Lake Erie islands and certain lakes, to maintain habitat health.
